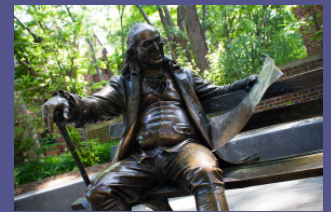

- Objective:
 - Identify gaps in CRC programs to provide technical assistance to FQHCs
 - Conduct implementation research on evidence-based strategies to increase CRC screening
- March 2016 to Present
- Partners: The American Cancer Society Southeastern Division and the Health Federation of Philadelphia
- Status:
 - 3 FQHC Sites Currently Enrolled
 - Needs Assessment and Process Mapping Complete

UPENN PRC IMPACT SEMINAR (ADAPTED EVIDENCE ACADEMY)

- Seminar: Accelerating Policies and Research on Food Access, Diet, and Obesity Prevention
- Date: April 26-27, 2017
- Support: PRC Training Core, CPCRN, Office of the Provost Impact Seminar Grant
- Collaborators: Participation from 5 PRCs (Including UNC)
- Description:
 - Thursday: A student health pitch competition designed for students to pitch innovative public health pitch solutions to an audience and a panel of judges.
 - Friday: One-day regional meeting to learn about the latest evidence and model programs that make a difference in food access, diet, and obesity prevention. Information and topic sessions encouraged action planning allowing attendees to be exposed to the most relevant and applicable information and tools
- Total Attendees: 150

PROSTATE CANCER ACTIVE SURVEILLANCE PILOT GRANT (PCAS)

- Direct Outcome of the Prostate Cancer Evidence Academy (November 2015)
- Leads: Dr. Karen Glanz, UPenn & Dr. Ron Myers, Jefferson
- Duration: 07/01/16 – 06/30/17
- Funding: Perelman School of Medicine at UPenn
- Purpose: To explore patient and provider perceptions and beliefs about treatment decision making, genomic risk assessment, and decision aids or decision supports for men diagnosed with localized, low-risk localized PCa.
- Participants: Enrolling 25 patients at each site with localized, low-risk PCa who have not yet made a treatment decision; patients who are on an AS regimen and have the options of continuing AS or have AT to consider; and 8-10 physicians who care for patients with localized, low-risk PCa.
- Methods
 - Chart Reviews
 - Patient Surveys & Interviews
 - Clinician Focus Groups



PCAS STATUS

- Patient group: recruitment phase
 - Continually enrolling patients via electronic medical records and through provider referrals
 - Mailing opt-out letters to eligible patients
 - Working with providers and IT to optimize effectiveness and efficiency of screening process
 - Current recruitment: Identified 30 eligible participants, mailed 13 opt-out letters, 17 waiting for provider permission
- Provider group:
 - Final discussion group guide
 - Group scheduled at Jefferson University
 - Date TBD at University of Pennsylvania
